## Wingham Beef Week 14th - 17th May

Ten students and three steers represented Taree High School at Wingham Beef Week. Competition started on Tuesday 14th with junior judging. Parading competitions continued over the next two days, which included a new event, the Weebollabolla/Manildra Group School Steer Challenge, where Taree High School was one of 13 schools to have been allocated a steer. The aim of the Challenge was to monitor the growth of a donated shorthorn steer over a period of 100 days, ideally reaching marketable size by Beef Week. About half the competition steers achieved this, with Taree's steer Plasyd being one of those gaining a reprieve and being returned to the farm. Events concluded on Friday with a visit to Wingham Beef Exports to see our steers on the hook. This was followed by prize giving and clean up. Taree High School repeated the success of last year's competition in the hook section, with Paxtin winning the Champion Led Light Middleweight Steer ribbon and Prince winning the Champion Led Heavy Middleweight Steer ribbon.

We would like to congratulate the Show Team for their competition successes this year, which reflect the enthusiasm and passion with which the Team have devoted themselves to the preparation of the animals in their care.
