# INFORMATION ON SCHOOL FEES

May 2020

Dear Parent/Guardian

Due to Covid 19 all 50 hour course fees for Semester 1 2020 have been cancelled. 100 hour (full year courses) have had the course fees adjusted as follows: Yr 12 to pay  $\frac{1}{4}$  of total fee, Yr 11 to pay 1/3 of total fee, Yr 10 to pay  $\frac{1}{2}$  of total fee. If you have already paid fees for 2020 courses, these payments have been credited to your students account & will show as an unallocated credit on the Statement of Account.

You will be aware that Taree High School provides opportunities for students to study subjects with practical components that often require the use of special equipment and materials. The school seeks your support in contributing to the cost of these materials used and consumed by students studying the courses of their choice. These payments allow the school to provide additional benefits to students. Note that students may not be permitted to study a course if they have not paid the contributions required for courses studied previously in that subject area. For some courses the items that students have made cannot be taken home until these subject contributions have been paid. Any student who wishes to participate in a non compulsory excursion/camp will not be permitted to attend unless all subject contributions are paid or regular part payments are being made.

Should you have difficulty making these payments for subject materials, please contact the Principal.

The yearly general school contribution for 2020 has been set at \$40.00. The school welcomes your contribution as this will significantly enhance the resources made available to students. If your statement has an unallocated credit showing this can be put towards your fees owing. Please phone the Office to arrange this.

Payments can be made using the Parent Online Payments (POP) system by accessing the schools website <a href="https://www.taree-h.schools.nsw.edu.au">www.taree-h.schools.nsw.edu.au</a>. The 'Make a Payment' link can be found on the ribbon on the school's website. By selecting this link you will be taken to a secure Westpac payment page. Payments can still be made in person at the office using cash, cheque or EFTPOS, or a credit card payment over the phone.



- 5. Use prep classes and 'free periods' to do tasks.








# ENGLISH






# LIBRARY TIMES






