Bunnings Teen Tradies Taree Bunnings 9-11 April 2024

The Bunnings Teen Tradies concept is part of an overall initiative from Erin Lute of Regional Industry and Education Partnerships (RIEP) and Bunnings to support low socio-economic school students enter into vocational pathways from school.

Bunnings also see benefits in a" grown your own" employees' program to address staffing shortages and attract quality long term employees. For Taree High School students, Bunnings is seen as a premium brand to work for, and students are very motivated to seek opportunities with them. In a regional comprehensive high school like Taree High School, vocational pathways as a transition point from school account for about 80% of students. Bridging the gap between what is experienced in the school environment and what is required from employers is always a challenge. The beauty of the Teen Tradies program is that students are exposed to higher level of expectation that would be normal in a standard work experience placement.

Students, whilst tentative early, quickly move from their comfort zones and gain confidence in a real workplace setting. They seem to enjoy the teambased project challenge. This group are constructing cabinetry for a community kitchen that supports people in real need in town. At the end of the program, students are given valuable advice on how job applications work and encouraged to apply for Bunnings employment. For some students, this will be their first job. The success of this program has opened opportunities for upscaling into other local industries who are keen to attract workers, trainees or apprentices.

# HARMONY DAY



Thursday 21st March, we celebrated Harmony Day and Students in Year 7 & 8 were lucky to join in some activities on the day.

We were grateful to host Sundus Jamil, Migrant Settlement worker, from the Manning Valley Neighbourhood Service. Sundus migrated from Pakistan to Australia in 2012, she shared with our students her stories, culture and the importance of approaching people from other cultures with kindness and compassion as we are all human-beings. She generously gave a cooking demonstration of a dish from her culture that is regularly eaten throughout the month of Ramadan, Pakora. It was received with glowing reviews from the students, many asking for the recipe and some even offering to sign her up for Masterchef! Sundus explained the significance of Ramadan for her culture, the principles and core values it represents including self-betterment through self-discipline, self-control, empathy for others, charity and generosity. Our students showed great respect, curiosity and enthusiasm throughout the presentation and tasting of the delicious treats Sundus prepared.

Activities included: cooking/taste testing with Sundus from Pakistan (Manning Valley Neighbourhood Centre), Aunty Eileen and Aunty Tannika, Weaving with Ms Piercy and Kieara and Traditional Dancing with Uncle Russ, Josh and Khai.

Aunty Eileen and Aunty Tannika spoke to the students about what Harmony Day means to them and the effects on their culture. Whilst taking to the students Aunty Eileen was showing the students how to make and cook johnny cakes (fried scones) and even had the opportunity to taste them. Students also had the opportunity to taste some Kangaroo.

Ms Piecry was in our beautiful LOTE Room showing students how to weave some bracelets and headbands. While some students were really good at making their bracelets some needed a little bit more practice. But great effort by all students who attempted to make the bracelets.

While Uncle Russ, Josh and Khai was down on the grassed area showing our students some of our traditional dancers. It was so great to see so many students participating and having a go. Students learnt how to do the Kangaroo, goanna, eagle, emu. Josh also showed the students something he learnt from the Torres Strait Islander people, it's called the rhythm dance they kids as young as 4 learn it.

We hope students enjoyed the day and we thank you for taking part and showing Cooperation Participation and Respect to all staff and presenters.

### OUTSTANDING PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AWARD FOR 2023 MR GLEN BOWMEN



Mr Glen Bowmen is a professional member of the Careers Advisor's Association of NSW & ACT and a valued member of his local careers advisors network, The Lower North Coast Careers Advisor's Association. Over the past 15 plus years Glen has been treasurer of his local careers advisor network, and for many years the organiser of the Taree future options expo.

In 2022, Glen was the key careers advisor representative to initiate, plan and execute the new look expo at Taree called Careerquip, which offers the broader community and schools from Bulahdelah, Gloucester, Great Lakes, Taree, Port Macquarie and Kempsey the opportunity to access nearly 100 exhibitors such as employers, local council, Defence industry, universities, TAFE and private colleges. Glen worked collaboratively with Taree Universities Campus, Taree Chamber of Commerce, Mid Coast Council, Mid Coast Connect, local media, caterers and schools. Glen developed a website for the event which allows exhibitors to register and pay fees and schools to register and plan their visit. Glen secured funding from a variety of sources completed a comprehensive risk assessment and employed security for the event.

Glen has also worked with local schools to arrange work placement for hospitality and entertainment students who provided the catering and entertainment for the event. The inaugural event was such a huge success, many stakeholders have asked to be included in all future events giving not only students, but young people in the broader community the opportunity to seek career advice and plan towards future endeavours.

#### Wellbeing Report for Term 1

**BATYR - Year 11 & 12** 

This Term, Year 11 and 12 were given a presentation by BATYR as part of their Life Ready program. BATYR are a Youth Mental Health organisation who focus on empowering Young People with the confidence and skills to get through tough times, the importance of looking out for your mates and breaking the stigma around Mental Health. The presentation focused on how to identify changes in behaviour and how to have conversations with your friends if you are worried about them, a story shared by one of the presenters with their personal and very raw lived experience of mental health issues and information on where to seek help if the students are struggling. Our students were all extremely respectful and interactive throughout the programs, BATYR gave wonderful feedback on the behaviour and engagement shown by them all. Thank you to BATYR for sharing this important information that our students can take with them as they become Young Adults and highlighting the importance of speaking up for ourselves and friends.

#### Breakfast Club -

Breakfast Club has returned this year and continues to be extremely popular! The Student Support Officers and General Assistant (School Celebrity), Sean Jarvis, are serving up free ham & cheese toasties, juice and fruit on Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday mornings. Breakfast Club is an initiative to ensure students are starting the day with some food in their bellies to fuel their big day of learning. Breakfast Club starts at 8:15am and last toasties going down at 8:55am, ensure you arrive early so you don't miss out!




